New Access Requirements for all Scheduled Visitors & Groups Needing Access to Dundalk & Seagirt Marine Terminals

Effective February 12, 2013

Please be advised that all **Visitors and Groups** needing access to the **Dundalk & Seagirt Marine Terminals Monday through Friday between 7:30 am and 3:30 pm** will now be required to go to the **Access Control Center (ACC)** prior to entering the facility. Access outside of this time frame will be processed from the Dundalk/Seagirt Visitors Gate and will not require a visit to the ACC. The ACC is located at 2001 Broening Highway, Baltimore, Maryland. The center will serve as a “one stop shop” for visitors to the port, badging for port employees and vehicle decals for those authorized to bring a vehicle onto the terminal. The center has a large parking lot for a convenient place to meet those needing an escort. These access changes do not apply to Crew Members, Vendors and commercial entities including commercial drivers picking up or delivering cargo.

Effective **Tuesday, February 12th, 2013** any Visitor or Group requiring access to Dundalk or Seagirt Marine Terminal must report to the ACC prior to their arrival at the Dundalk/Seagirt Visitors Gate. All scheduled Visitors and Groups (actively registered in mVisitor) will have **15 minutes** to report to the Dundalk/Seagirt Visitors Gate once they have been issued a Visitor/Vehicle or Group Permit. Visitors and Groups will be required to present verifiable, valid government issued identification such as a driver’s license, TWIC card or passport at the ACC and at the Dundalk/Seagirt Visitors Gate for verification by security guard personnel. All Visitors who do not have a valid TWIC card must know and provide the name of their authorized MPA TWIC Escort. Authorized MPA TWIC Escorts are encouraged to meet their Visitors/Groups at the ACC or prior to the terminal entrance. No one should park in either the inbound or outbound lanes of the entrance gate and wait for their visitor or wait to be escorted.

Failure to properly register visitors and their vehicle information with the MPA or its Tenants will unfortunately result in delays or your access being denied. Visitors returning to the facility the same day will not need to re-visit the ACC if they have already been once that day. The mVisitor system will recognize those who have already been to the ACC. Visitors/Groups will continue to exit the facility as they do today.

We hope this security enhancement of separating visitor authorization from the regular employee traffic ensures the steady flow of traffic at our entrance gate. Directions to the new Access Control Center are as follows:

From I-95 North, take Exit 57, Boston Street/O’Donnell Street. Bear right onto Interstate Avenue. Turn Right onto O’Donnell Street cutoff and keep straight onto Boston Street. Turn Right onto Broening Highway. Access Control Center entrance is 0.7 miles on the left.

From I-95 South, take Exit 57 ramp right for O'Donnell Street toward Boston Street. Turn left on Ponca Street. In 0.6 miles road name changes to Poncabird Pass. Keep straight to Holabird Avenue. Turn Right onto Broening Highway. Access Control Center entrance is 0.3 miles on the left.

From I-895 North, Baltimore Harbor Tunnel keep straight on I-895 Harbor Tunnel Throughway. At Exit 10, take ramp to Holabird Avenue toward Dundalk. Bear left onto Holabird Avenue. In 0.4 Miles turn Right onto Broening Highway. Access Control Center entrance is 0.3 miles on the left.

From I-695 East, toward Key Bridge/Dundalk (road name changes to I-695 N), take Exit 44 and follow signs to Broening Highway. Turn Left onto Broening Highway. Access Control center entrance is 3.4 miles on the right.
